Antigone thesis statements (Sheridan-Baker)

3 flaws lead to 1 consequence

OR

1 flaw leads to 3 consequences

Although <u>(another character) is also flawed, (your character's 3 flaws) lead to (1 consequence)</u>

Although Creon shouldn't be so stubborn, Antigone's suicidal tendencies, dramatic language, and impulsive actions lead to her own downfall.

Although many characters in the play are flawed, (your character's 1 flaw) leads to (3 consequences)

Although many characters in the play are flawed, Antigone's recklessness leads to Haimon's death, Creon's downfall, and her own demise.

Blended: 3 flaws, 3 consequences

Although many characters are flawed, Antigone is the real tragic hero because her recklessness, impulsivity, and stubbornness lead to everyone's downfall.

(her death, Creon's punishment, and Haemon & Eurydice's suicides)

* Avoid this type of thesis statement, unless you are willing to thoroughly argue each component of the argument.
