

MLA STYLE – Works Cited
MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers, 7th ed. 2009

The Modern Language Association's format for citing and referencing multiple sources is commonly used in the humanities, especially the fields of English, literature and languages. This format requires that all quoting, paraphrasing, and summarizing from other sources be cited in the body of the text (your paper), and that these sources be listed in alphabetical order on a "Works Cited" page at the end of your paper. **The "Works Cited" page is double-spaced, uses a hanging indent and has one-inch margins on all sides.** The following examples provide basic citation guidelines. Print Publications

Journal article, 1 author

Piper, Andrew. "Rethinking the Print Object: Goethe and the Book of Everything." *PMLA* 121.1 (2006): 124-38. Print.

Journal article, 2 or more authors

Brueggeman, Brenda Jo, and Debra A. Modellmog. "Coming-Out Pedagogy: Risking Identity in Language and Literature Classrooms." *Pedagogy* 2.3 (2002): 311-35. Print.

*Note that the second author begins with first name and then last name; authors' names are separated by commas.

Newspaper article

Haughney, Christine. "Women Unafraid of Condo Commitment." *New York Times* 10 Dec. 2006, late ed., sec. 11:1+. Print.

Magazine article

Weintraub, Arlene, and Laura Cohen. "A Thousand-Year Plan for Nuclear Waste." *Business Week* 6 May 2002: 94-96. Print.

Book, 1 author

Hacker, Diana. *A Writer's Reference*. 6th ed. Boston: Bedford/St. Martin's, 2007. Print.

Book, 2 or more authors

Follow the same rules above for articles with 2 or more authors.

Book with editors

Casti, John L., and Anders Karlqvist, eds. *Mission to Abisko: Stories and Myths in the Creation of Scientific Truth*. Reading, Mass: Perseus, 1999. Print.

Work in an anthology

Kieschnick, John. "Material Culture." *The Oxford Handbook of Religion and Emotion*. Ed. John Corrigan. Oxford: Oxford UP, 2008. 223-40. Print.

Reference book article

"Ginsburg, Ruth Bader." *Who's Who in America*. 62nd ed. 2008. Print.
